

- 1. To receive, consider and adopt the Audited Financial Statements of the Association for the financial year ended March 31, 2023 together with the Auditors' Report thereon and the Executive Committee's Report to the Members.
- 2. To appoint an Executive Committee Member in the place of Mr. D Srinivasan (DIN 00948568) who retires by rotation and is eligible for re-appointment

- 1 The statement pursuant to Section 102(1) of the Companies Act, 2013 in respect of the Special Business under item No. 9 of the Notice is annexed.
- 2 A member entitled to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting (the "Meeting") is entitled to appoint a proxy to attend and vote on a poll instead of himself and the proxy should be a member of the Association.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 105 of the Companies Act 2013, a proxy shall not be entitled to vote excepting through a ballot paper. Further a proxy shall not have any right to speak at the meeting. A Member can act as a proxy on behalf of members not exceeding fifty.

- 3. The instrument appointing proxy in order to be valid should be deposited at the Registered Office of the Association, not less than 48 hours before the commencement of the Meeting. Organizational members are requested to send to the Association, a duly certified copy of the nomination of a member authorizing him/her to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting
- 4 **Book Closure**: The Register of Members will remain closed from September 9, 2023 to September 16, 2023 (both days inclusive).
- 5. Members/Proxies should bring in their Attendance slip sent herewith duly filled in for attending the Meeting. ONLY MEMBERS/PROXIES WILL BE ADMITTED INTO THE AUDITORIUM FOR THE MEETING.
- 6. The Register of Executive Committee Members maintained under Section 170 of the Companies Act, 2013 will be available for inspection by the Members at the Annual General Meeting.
- 7. Brief resume of the Executive Committee Members seeking re-appointment/appointment is provided as annexure to this Notice.
- 8. Notice of AGM along with the Proxy form and Attendance Slip is being sent to all the Members of the Association to their mailing address registered with the Association. Notice of AGM and the Annual Report for the year 2022-23 are also being sent by electronic mode to members whose e-mail IDs are registered with the Association.
- 9. In line with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) Circular No. 17/2020 dated April 13, 2020, the Notice calling the Annual General Meeting and the Annual Report for the year 2022-23 will be uploaded on the website of the Association at www.sihra.in. The Annual General Meeting ("AGM") Notice will also available on the website of CDSL (agency for providing the Remote e-Voting facility) i.e. https://www.evotingindia.com
- 10. As a measure of economy and a step toward green initiative, copies of the Annual Report will not be distributed at the venue of the Annual General Meeting.
- 11. To support the 'Green Initiative', Members who have not yet registered their email addresses are requested to register the same with the Association to enable the Association to serve notices/documents/Annual Reports and other communications electronically to their e-mail address in future.
- 12. **Registration of email addresses:** Eligible Members whose e-mail addresses are not registered with the Association are required to provide the same to the Association on or before 5:00 p.m. IST on September 9, 2023. (at least 7 days before the AGM date) to enable the Association to send the Notice, along with the Annual Report, Proxy form and the Attendance slip.
- 13. Members who have not registered their email addresses with the Association are required to send an email request to admin@sihra.in/membership@sihra.in/accounts@sihra.in mentioning their member code, Name of the Hotel/Restaurant name to get the user id and password for e-voting during the remote e-voting period.
- 14. Further, those Members who have already registered their e-mail addresses are requested to keep their e-mail addresses validated/ updated with the Association

Updation of Members details:

15. The format of the Register of Members as prescribed by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs under the Act, to record additional details of Members, including ownership of the Hotel/Restaurants, the details of the PAN, email address, persons authorized on behalf of the owner establishment including the CIN No., Registration No., GSTIN, Legal Name, Trade Name, persons responsible for the respective hotels/restaurants etc. The Association is maintaining the Register of Members as per the prescribed format and updates these details as and when the same are provided by the Members.

Voting through electronic means

16. In compliance with the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (as amended), the Association is providing facility of remote e-Voting to its Members to exercise their right to vote on the resolutions proposed to be passed at the 72nd Annual General Meeting. The members can cast their votes electronically during the remote e-voting period,

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through the e-voting services provided by Central Depository Services (India) Limited (CDSL), the agency engaged by the Association for providing e-voting facility to the Members.

- 17. Members of the Association as on the cut-off date of September 8, 2023 (i.e. the date prior to the date of commencement of the book closure date) may cast their vote by remote e-Voting. The remote e-Voting period commences on September 13, 2023 at 9.00 a.m. (IST) and ends on September 15, 2023 at 5.00 p.m. (IST). The remote e-Voting module shall be disabled by CDSL for voting thereafter. Once the vote on a resolution is cast by the Member, the Member shall not be allowed to change it subsequently.
- 18. In addition, the facility for voting through ballot paper shall also be made available at the venue of the AGM and the Members attending the AGM who have not cast their vote by remote e-voting shall be eligible to cast their vote at the AGM venue.
- 19. A Member (Hotel or Restaurant) whose name is recorded in the Register of Members as on the cut-off date only shall be entitled to avail the facility of remote e-voting before the AGM or voting by ballot paper during the AGM. Any Member who becomes a Member of the Association after the dispatch of the Notice and holding voting rights as on the cut-off date, i.e. September 8, 2023, may obtain the User ID and password by sending a request to the Association at admin@sihra.in/membership@sihra.in/accounts@sihra.in
- 20. The Association has appointed KSM Associates, Company Secretaries, Chennai and Mr. S Subbaraman, Advocate, Chennai as the scrutinizers to scrutinize the remote e-voting and physical voting at the venue of the AGM in a fair and transparent manner.
- 21 The Members desiring to vote through remote e-voting are requested to refer to the detailed e-voting procedure given hereunder.

22. Procedure for "Remote E-voting" is detailed hereunder:

EVEN, User ID and password are provided at the bottom of the Attendance slip for the Annual General Meeting

- i) Log on to the e-voting website www.evotingindia.com
- ii) Click on "Member" tab
- iii) Now enter your user ID as provided in the Attendance Slip/top of the email sent by CDSL and i.e. the Membership no. registered with the Association and then enter the image verification as displayed and click on "Login".
- iv) Enter the password given in the e-mail communication from CDSL/attendance slip sent by the Association.
- v) After entering these details appropriately, click on "SUBMIT" tab.
- vi) Members will then reach directly the Company selection screen.
- vii) Click on the EVSN for SOUTH INDIA HOTELS AND RESTAURANTS ASSOCIATION on which you choose to vote.
- viii) On the voting page, you will see "Resolution Description" and against the same option "YES/NO" for voting. Select the option YES or NO as desired. The option YES implies that you assent to the Resolution and option NO implies that you dissent to the Resolution.
- ix) Click on the "RESOLUTIONS FILE LINK" if you wish to view the entire Resolution details.
- x) After selecting the Resolution you have decided to vote on, click on 'SUBMIT". A confirmation box will be displayed. If you wish to confirm your vote, click on "OK", else to change your vote, click on "CANCEL" and accordingly modify your vote.
- xi) Once you confirm your vote on the Resolution, you will not be allowed to modify your vote.
- xii) You can also take a print out of the voting done by you by clicking on "Click here to Print" option on the Voting page.
- xiii) Non-individual owners, who are partnership firms or body (ies) corporate and not individuals, who are the owners of the hotels/restaurants registered as Members of the Association are required to log on to https://www.evotingindia.com and register themselves as Corporates.
- xiv) They are required to submit a scanned copy of the Registration form bearing the stamp of the entity to helpdesk.evoting@cdslindia.com.
- xv) After receiving the login details they have to create a compliance user using the admin login and password. The compliance user would be able to link the account(s) which they wish to vote on.
- xvi) They should send scanned copy (PDF/JPG format) of the relevant Board Resolution/ Authority letter etc. which they have issued in favour of the authorized signatory (ies) together with attested specimen signature of the duly authorized signatory (ies) who are authorized to vote, to the scrutinizer through e-mail with a copy marked to helpdesk.evoting@cdslindia.com

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xvii) The list of accounts should be mailed to helpdesk.evoting@cdslindia.com and on approval of the accounts they would be able to cast their vote.

Other instructions:

- Members who are already registered with CDSL, for e-voting can use the existing user ID and password/PIN for casting their votes.
- Members are requested to update their mobile numbers and e-mail id in the user profile details of the Membership no. which may be used for sending future communication(s).
- iii. The voting rights of Members shall be in proportion to the number of votes they are eligible for on the cut-off date, i.e September 8, 2023. The number of votes a member is eligible for is calculated on the basis of 1 (ONE) vote for every Rs. 100/- paid as subscription fees for the year.
- iv. The Members who have cast their votes by remote e-voting prior to the AGM may also attend the AGM but shall not be entitled to cast their votes again.
- The Member can opt for only one mode of voting i.e. either through remote e-voting or by ballot at the venue of the AGM. If a member casts vote by both modes, then voting done through remote e-voting shall prevail and ballot shall be treated as invalid.
- vi. The Chairman shall at the AGM, at the end of discussions on the resolutions on which voting is to be held, allow voting with the assistance of scrutinizers by ballot paper, all those members who are present at the AGM but have not cast their votes by availing the remote e-voting facility.
- vii. The scrutinizer shall by the end of conclusion of the voting at the AGM venue will first count the votes cast at the meeting and thereafter unblock the votes cast through remote e-voting in the presence of at least two (2) witnesses not in the employment of the Association and shall make not later than 3 days of the conclusion of the AGM, a consolidated Scrutinizer's report of the total votes cast in favour or against, if any, to the President or a person authorized by him in writing, who shall counter sign the same and declare the result of the voting forthwith.
- viii. The results declared along with the report of the scrutinizers shall be placed on the website of the Association and on the website of CDSL immediately after the declaration of result by the President or a person authorized by him in writing.

19. Subject to receipt of requisite number of votes, the Resolutions shall be deemed to have been passed on the date of Annual General Meeting.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE'S REPORT

To the Members of The South India Hotels and Restaurants Association

Executive Committee Members of The South India Hotels and Restaurants Association (SIHRA) have great pleasure in presenting the 72nd Annual Report of the Association together with its Audited Financial Statements for the financial year ended March 31, 2023.

Financial Results

Operating Results:

The Association has earned an income of Rs. 203.85 lakhs including the revenue of Rs. 109.95 lakhs from SIHRA Convention 2022 held in Bangalore, for the year ended March 31, 2023 which was Rs. 133.37 lakhs more than that of the previous year i.e. 189% more than that of the previous year. The depreciation for the year was Rs. 10.82 lakhs as compared to Rs. 11.89 lakhs for the previous year. The income over expenditure for the year amounts to Rs. 18.20 lakhs as compared to Rs. 2.07 lakhs for the previous year. Reserves and surplus as on March 31, 2023 stood at Rs. 625.28 lakhs as compared to Rs. 593.80 lakhs for the previous year. The financial results once again bear the testimony to the faith and support extended by the Members over the years and the sincere efforts of the Members of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee is confident that the Members would continue to extend their support to the functioning of the Association and also pay the Annual subscription dues on time which has been maintained for the last 3 years i.e. 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24 at 75% of the annual subscription for the year 2020-21.

The Income and Expenditure statement for the year ended March 31, 2023 and the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2023 are enclosed for the information and perusal of the Members.

Borrowings:

The Association has not borrowed any amounts from any financial institutions or banks during the year under review and has no borrowings.

Capital Expenditure:

During the financial year 2022-23, your Association has incurred a capital expenditure of Rs. 0.70 lakhs towards purchase of laptop/printer for the Association.

Fixed Deposits

The Association does not accept fixed deposits hence there are no dues on account of principal or interest on fixed deposits.

Loans, Guarantees or Investments

The Association has not given any loans or provided any security or guarantee during the financial year under review.

Particulars of contracts or arrangements made with related parties

There were no contracts, arrangements or transactions entered into during fiscal 2023 that fall under the scope of Section 188(1) of the Companies Act, 2013.



Subsidiaries, Joint Ventures and Associate Companies

The Association does not have any subsidiary, joint venture or Associate Companies.

Executive Committee of the Association:

The Executive Committee consists of 20 Members including the President and President of Honor. The Executive Committee Members elect amongst themselves, four Vice Presidents representing the Southern States, one each as Hony. Secretary and Hony. Treasurer.

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SIHRA CONVENTION 2022

SIHRA Convention 2022 was held during November 18-20, 2022 at Hotel Shangri-La, Bengaluru. The Convention was inaugurated by Mr. Basavaraj Bommai, the then Hon'ble Chief Minister of Karnataka and was attended by Tourism Ministers of Governments of Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry. More than 500 delegates participated in the Convention. There were 7 business sessions on current topics and all the business sessions were well attended by the delegates. An exhibition featuring products and technologies for the hospitality and restaurants was run concurrently with the Convention. SIHRA Convention 2022 was a grand success.

Activities of SIHRA including Meetings and memorandums submitted to Government officials

Meeting with Shri G Kishan Reddy, Hon'ble Minister of Tourism, Government of India: Mr Syama Raju, President of SIHRA, Mr. D V S Somaraju, EC Member, SIHRA and Hon Secretary FHRAI along with FHRAI delegation met Shri G Kishan Reddy, Hon'ble Minister of Development of North Eastern Region, Tourism and Culture, Government of India on 10th May 2022 at New Delhi and sought his support for revival of hospitality sector.

Tourism Stakeholders Meeting: Mr. Sundar participated in the Tourism stakeholders meeting organised by the Southern Regional Office, Ministry of Tourism, Government of India in Chennai to informally discuss the actions and activities to be carried out for development of tourism in Tamil Nadu.

Payments due to hoteliers: Continuous follow up by SIHRA with the Tamil Nadu Health Department Officials including the Health Secretary and the Finance Minister's office, had resulted in the Government of Tamil Nadu issuing a Government Order to clear Rs. 57 Crores due to hoteliers for the accommodation and food provided to doctors and nurses, paramedical staff worked in covid-19 isolation wards/covid care centers for the period April 2021 to November 21, 2021.

Meeting Kerala Government Officials: Mr. Sundar – Director-Operations, met Mr. Sparjan Kumar, IPS, Trivandram City Police Commissioner. He also met Mr. PB Nooh, IAS, Director – Kerala Tourism and appraised him of SIHRA's intention to play a proactive role in developing tourism in Kerala. The Director-Tourism had suggested to organize an interactive session with Kerala hoteliers to understand the concerns of hoteliers.

World Tourism Day celebrations: The Southern Regional Office, Ministry of Tourism supported and jointly celebrated the World Tourism Day along with SKAL Club, Coimbatore, SIHRA and various institutions at Coimbatore by organizing 75 activities in different urban and rural parts of Coimbatore commemorating the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav week of Ministry of Tourism involving students and stakeholders.

INDIA TOURISM PONGAL CELEBRATION FAMILIARIASATION TRIP

SIHRA was an associate sponsor for the event organized by the Ministry of Tourism, Government of India, Southern Regional Office in association with Tamil Nadu Tourism, Puducherry Tourism and Thanjavur Tourism Promotion Council as part of Pongal Festival Celebrations 2023.

Hoteliers meeting:

Hoteliers meet in Trivandrum: An interactive meeting with the hoteliers was organized in Trivandrum and 45 hoteliers participated in the meeting. Members had discussions on various issues including classification of hotels and requested SIHRA's support in escalating their concerns to the State and Union Governments. The participants thanked SIHRA and President, Mr. K Syama Raju for their efforts in addressing the issues affecting the hoteliers.

Trichy Hoteliers Meet: SIHRA along with TTF organised an interactive session with Trichy Hoteliers on April 12, 2022 at Ramyas Hotel, Trichy to discuss the strategy for increasing revenue after the intensity of COVID-19 had come down and promoting Trichy as a destination in collaboration with the Government of Tamil Nadu. Thirty-five hoteliers took part, offered their perspectives and pledged their support for each other's interests.

SIHRA EC members' meeting with Hoteliers at Trichy: SIHRA President, Mr. K Syama Raju and EC members met the hoteliers in Trichy on December 18, 2022. More than 40 hoteliers participated in the interactive session. The hoteliers were happy that they were able to freely voice their concerns and that the Association would take steps to redress their concerns by addressing the issues with the concerned authorities.

Hoteliers meeting at Kodaikanal: SIHRA had an interactive session with hoteliers at The Carlton, Kodaikanal on June 16, 2023. President of SIHRA, Mr. K Syama Raju, chaired the session and nearly thirty hoteliers participated in the discussions. Hoteliers expressed their concerns, grievances and issues affecting the smooth running of their hotels. Hoteliers were happy to have had a very useful interaction with the President, Mr. K Syama Raju and Mr. S K Hari Arumugam, EC Member, SIHRA.



MEETING WITH HR MANAGERS AND GENERAL MANAGERS ON INDUSTRY AWARENESS DRIVE ON NATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP SCHEME

One-on-one meeting was organised on January 10, 2023 with Mr. Vijay Shanker Pandey, Director of Training (BOAT) Southern Region, to benefit from the National Apprenticeship Scheme (NATS). 35 Hotel HR Managers from the hotels in Chennai had discussions on the SIHRA Skill development model to produce Human Resources for the hospitality industry. Mr. Vijay Shankar Pandey, Director of Training (BOAT), Southern Region made a presentation on National Apprenticeship Scheme (NATS) and interacted with the Members about the significant benefits of the scheme. Mr. Sundar Singaram - Director - Operations, SIHRA proposed short and long term solutions to overcome human resource challenges which was well appreciated by all the HR Managers.

SIHRA as Training Partner:

SIHRA has been approved as a Training Partner in Green Channel by the Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation (TNSDC), the State Nodal Agency for Skill Development by the Tamil Nadu Government. A communication regarding the skill development initiative by sourcing and skilling manpower from rural and suburban areas with the support of Tamil Nadu Government was sent to all the SIHRA Members from Tamil Nadu requesting them to express their interest in joining the move to motivate school and college students to opt for hospitality and tourism as a career. SIHRA is making efforts to have training centres in Trichy and Madurai.

Activities of and at SIHRA

"SIHRA Connect", an online platform, exclusively for the Members of the Association was launched and a detailed presentation was made to the Members. Through this online platform, knowledge sharing sessions and webinars would be conducted for the benefit of Members. Members also would be able to present their hotels online at a nominal cost, to the audience of travel agents and tour operators.

Activation of Social Media

Face book, LinkedIn and Twitter accounts of the Association have been activated.

All Government Orders (G O), circulars relating to the hospitality and tourism industry is being circulated to the Members through whatsapp immediately after the same are released by the Government.

Membership of the Association

Your Association is taking various steps and activities in order to increase the membership of the Association.

Your Association is doing its best for hospitality growth in South India by holding its Executive Committee Meetings in smaller towns and neighboring areas, with good tourism potential. EC members interact with local bodies and associations for strengthening partnerships for better growth.

Efforts are being made to increase the membership of the Association. The EC Members are organising meetings of hoteliers/ restaurateurs in their respective regions, wherein brochures detailing the activities of the Association are distributed to those who are present at such meetings to enable the attendees to fully understand the benefits of being associated with the Association as its Members. More such meetings are planned in Pondicherry, places in the States of Kerala and Karnataka for the benefit of hoteliers of the respective States.

Appeals filed before the Income Tax Appellate Tribunal

Three appeals were filed by the Association against the orders dated 12.01.2018 of the learned Commissioner of Income-tax (Appeals). Issues and facts of the case of all appeals are similar. The Association being a charitable institution registered under Section 12A (a) of the Income-tax Act, 1961 (the Act), carries out activities covered under the definition of "Charitable purpose" enumerated in Section 2(15) of the Act. The Association filed its return of income for the assessment years 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2014-15.

The Association had appealed against the order of the Assessing Officer before the learned Commissioner (Appeals), and the CIT (Appeals) confirmed the order of the Assessing Officer in denying the claim made under Section 11 of the Act as there is no benefit to the public at large and no charitable activity is carried on by the Association

The Association filed an appeal against the order of CIT (Appeals) before the learned Appellate Tribunal. As per the learned Appellate Tribunal, any activity of rendering any service in relation to any trade, commerce for a cess or fee or any other consideration, irrespective of the nature of use or application or retention of the income

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from such activity is not charity and the Association was only doing services to its members in relation to hotel business, and considering the proviso to section 2(15) of the Act, the activities of the Association could not be considered as charitable activity. The learned Tribunal, based on the findings of the Assessing Officer, confirmed the order of the Assessing officer and the CIT (Appeals), that the Association was doing only consolidation of its manpower, potential and use for the benefit of the members of the Association and no benefit to the public at large, and dismissed the appeals.

Your Association has filed a petition against the order of the Learned Tribunal before the Hon'ble High Court of Madras.

M/s Rao & Gopal Chartered Accountants, (ICAI Registration No. 003085S) Chennai, the Auditors of the Association hold office as Statutory Auditors up to the conclusion of the ensuing Annual General Meeting of the Association. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 139(2) of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules 2014, M/s Rao & Gopal are eligible for appointment as Auditors. The Association has received a written communication from M/s Rao & Gopal that their appointment, if made, would satisfy the criteria provided in Section 141 of the Companies Act, 2013 for their appointment. The Executive Committee recommends the appointment of M/s Rao & Gopal, Chartered Accountants as the Auditors of the Association for a period of 5 years from the conclusion of the ensuing 72nd Annual General Meeting up to conclusion of the 76th Annual General Meeting.

Further, the report of the Statutory Auditors along with the notes to Schedules is enclosed to this report. The observations made in the Auditors' Report are self-explanatory and therefore do not call for any further comments.




